

SECTION 4

TESTS

Effective 1st May 2010

A. GENERAL REGULATIONS

Rule 400

The steps, patterns, jumps, spins and dances referred to in these regulations are as set out in the Schedules.

Rule 401

1. Tests in single free skating, pair skating and ice dancing are conducted by State associations on behalf of the Association, and in accordance with these regulations. Deviation from the regulations will invalidate the test.
2. Eligible and ineligible persons may take any test.
3. Every candidate for a test must be a financial member of a State association, and must have paid the required fees which shall be set by the Council.
4. Every candidate passing a test will be awarded a certificate of merit, and, where designated in these regulations, a lapel pin is also awarded when the appropriate test is passed.
5. The ISA Test judge(s) who conducted the test should sign the certificate of merit at the time of test. In the event the original testing judge(s) are unable to sign the certificate, another suitably qualified ISA Test Judge (s) who has viewed the candidates' test paper will sign the certificate of merit.
6. A candidate wishing to take a test shall make application to the Secretary or the appointed representative of a State association, in writing, and accompanied by the required fee or proof of payment.
7. The candidate may indicate in the application the date and place at which it is wished to take the test.

Rule 402

1. Except where otherwise specified, each test must be taken on one day, with the same panel of judges.
2. The Referee may terminate the test if the ice, music, or any other condition is not satisfactory.
3. At the discretion of the judges, a candidate may be permitted to re-skate any part of a test without penalty where the performance was adversely affected by circumstances beyond the candidate's control.

Rule 403

1. The State association conducting the test shall at the end of March, June, September and December, after a test is attempted advise the Association's Test Officer of the candidate's name, the type and level of test, and whether it was passed or failed.
2. At the same time, a rate determined by the Association for each test attempted must be paid by the State association.

Rule 404

A candidate who has failed a test shall not be entitled to be judged again for that test prior to the 28th day following the failed test.

Rule 405

1. Marking must be in accordance with the rules applying to the particular level of skating, and any special rules set out in the test requirements.
2. The closed marking system shall be used for all tests.

Rule 406

When more than one candidate is taking a test of the same level during the same test session, the order of skating shall be determined by the Referee.

Rule 407

1. A candidate for a test must have passed the prior level test.
2. A candidate for the Elementary Test in Ice Dancing must first have passed the Preliminary Test.
 - a) A candidate who has passed the Senior Singles level test may commence tests in Ice Dancing from the Novice level test.
 - b) A candidate who has passed the Junior Singles level test may commence tests in Ice Dancing from the Primary level test.
3. Qualifying tests are required for entry into championships and international competitions.
4. Persons taking up residence in Australia and seeking to compete in championships, other than as guest skaters, or to represent Australia internationally are required to undertake applicable ISA tests as follows:
 - a) For entry into Primary and Novice Championships
 - i) Production of documentary evidence of the equivalent requisite qualifying test of another ISU Member must be provided OR
 - ii) If the equivalent tests of another ISU Member are below the requisite qualifying test, then the skater must pass all ISA tests from the equivalent test up to and including the requisite qualifying test.
 - b) On production of documentary evidence of participation in a national Junior or Senior Championship of another ISU Member, conducted in accordance with ISU Regulations, skaters will be deemed to have passed prerequisites for the championship qualifying test(s) and may attempt the applicable qualifying test(s) for Junior and Senior Championship entry and international competition entry.

Rule 408

1. At the Judges' discretion a candidate for a test is permitted to re-skate any portion of the test as specified in the requirements for the particular test.
2. Two Judges are required for all tests; one judge shall act as Referee
 - a) The Preliminary, Elementary and Pre-Primary Tests in both Single Skating and Ice Dancing and the Pre-Primary Pair Test requires only one judge, if that Judge is a Senior ISA Championship or Senior Level test Judge in the applicable category.
 - b) The Primary to Senior Dance Tests may use only one judge, in exceptional circumstances when approved by Ice Skating Australia, if that Judge is a Senior ISA Championship or Senior Level test Judge. In these circumstances the State Association is to advise Ice Skating Australia of this situation prior to the testing session occurring.
3. A candidate must receive a passing result from each Judge in order to pass a test.

4. Judges for tests must be National Test Judges at the appropriate level.

B. TESTS IN SINGLE SKATING

Rule 409

1. There are seven tests in Single skating.
2. REQUIREMENTS

PRELIMINARY LEVEL

[Four set figure patterns](#) comprising:

- a) F.O. curves
- b) F.I. curves
- c) B.O. curves
- d) B.I. curves

Repeats

In the case of a fall in any one of the patterns, that pattern may be repeated at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Mark

Each element is evaluated independently as a Pass or Fail.

All elements must Pass for the test to Pass overall.

ELEMENTARY AND PRE-PRIMARY TESTS

The Elementary and Pre-Primary test levels comprises two parts, Technical & Figure Pattern. Technical tests comprise free skating elements. Figure Pattern tests comprise edges and turns. Candidates may attempt these test levels as a whole or in part. Either the Technical or the Figure Pattern test may be attempted first. Candidates may also attempt only the Figure Pattern tests.

Certificates only are awarded for the successful completion of each part of each test level. Separate fees are payable when the tests are not taken as a whole.

ELEMENTARY LEVEL

Candidates attempting this test must have passed the Preliminary Singles Test.

TECHNICAL TEST

A free skating program of 1-1/2 minutes duration (+/- 10 seconds) to music of the skater's own choice (vocal music with lyrics not permitted). The following elements must be included:

- a) Flip jump
- b) Lutz jump
- c) Three jump / loop jump combination
- d) Upright spin with one change of foot
- e) Sit spin
- f) Camel spin (parallel spin)
- g) RFO Spiral
- h) LFO Spiral
- i) Straight line step sequence covering at least half the ice surface including three turns and Mohawks on both feet

Jumps

No jump is to receive the equivalent of a downgrade from the intended number of revolutions.

Spins

All spins must have at least 4 well-centred revolutions; 3 on each foot for change of foot spins. The exit from the back spin in the upright change foot is not required to be on the spinning foot. However, demonstration of good control during the spin and the exit is required.

Spirals

Spirals must be executed without any assistance.

Repeats

A maximum of two elements may be repeated twice without music at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Mark

The assessment will take into consideration the grade of execution of the elements and the program components in determining a pass or fail.

A pass cannot be awarded if any element has a GOE of -3.

The testis evaluated as a whole as either a Pass or a Fail.

FIGURE PATTERN TEST

A set of four figure pattern exercises, comprising a series of continuing circles of approximately one-half the height of the candidate, incorporating:

- a) Forward outside, forward inside, back outside and back inside edges
- b) Forward and backward cross-overs
- c) Forward and backward changes of edge
- d) Forward and backward three turns
- e) Mohawks.

Repeats

In the case of a fall in any one of the patterns, that pattern may be repeated at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Mark

Each element is evaluated independently as a Pass or Fail.

All elements must Pass for the test to Pass overall.

PRE-PRIMARY LEVEL

Candidates attempting the Technical Test part of the test must have passed the Technical part of the ISA Elementary Test. Candidates attempting the Figure Pattern test must have passed the Figure Pattern part of the ISA Elementary test.

TECHNICAL TEST

A free skating program of 2 minutes duration (+/- 10 seconds) to music of the skater's own choice (vocal music with lyrics not permitted). The following elements must be included:

- a) Axel jump
- b) Loop jump / loop jump combination
- c) Lutz jump / loop jump combination
- d) Camel spin / sit spin on one foot (a minimum of 6 revolutions in total)
- e) Sit spin with one change of foot (a minimum of 3 revolutions on each foot)
- f) Flying Camel spin (at least 4 revolutions)

- g) Spiral sequence comprising forward & backward spirals on both feet
- h) Straight line step sequence covering at least two-thirds of the ice surface including at least three turns and Mohawks on both feet

Jumps

No jump is to receive the equivalent of a downgrade from the intended number of revolutions.

Spins

All spins must have well-centred revolutions. The exit from the back foot in the change foot sit spin is not required to be on the spinning foot. However, demonstration of good control during the spin and the exit is required.

Spiral Sequence

At least one spiral must be executed without any assistance and at least one spiral is held for 3 seconds.

Repeats

A maximum of two elements may be repeated twice without music at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Marks

The assessment will take into consideration the grade of execution of the elements and the program components in determining a pass or fail.

A pass cannot be awarded if any element has a GOE of -3.

The test is evaluated as a whole as either a Pass or a Fail.

FIGURE PATTERN TEST

A set of four figure pattern exercises, comprising a series of continuing circles of approximately one-half the height of the candidate, incorporating:

- a) Forward outside, forward inside, back outside and back inside edges
- b) Forward and backward cross-overs
- c) Forward and backward changes of edge
- d) Forward and backward double three turns
- e) Mohawks

Repeats

In the case of a fall in any one of the patterns, that pattern may be repeated at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Marks

Each element is evaluated independently as a Pass or Fail.

All elements must Pass for the test to Pass overall.

PRIMARY LEVEL

Candidates attempting this test must have passed both Technical and Figure Pattern parts of the Pre-Primary Singles Test.

A Short Program skated to music of the candidate's choice. The duration must not exceed 2 minutes 50 seconds, but may be less providing all the following elements are included:

Men

- b) Axel Paulsen
- b) Double jump immediately preceded by connecting steps and/or other comparable free skating movements

- c) One jump combination consisting of any single or double jump followed by any double jump
- d) Flying spin (no change of foot, no change of position)
- e) Spin in one position (no change of foot, no flying entry)
- f) Spin combination with one change of foot and at least one change of position (sit, camel, upright or any variation thereof, no flying entry)
- g) Step sequence (straight line, circular or serpentine) fully utilising the ice surface

Ladies

- a) Axel Paulsen
- b) Double jump immediately preceded by connecting steps and/or other comparable free skating movements
- c) One jump combination consisting of any single or double jump followed by any double jump
- d) Flying spin (no change of foot, no change of position)
- e) Spin in one position (no change of foot, no flying entry)
- f) Spin combination with one change of foot and at least one change of position (sit, camel, upright or any variation thereof, no flying entry)
- g) Spiral sequence fully utilising the ice surface

Jumps

No jump is to receive the equivalent of a downgrade from the intended number of revolutions.

Spins

Flying Spin – minimum of 8 revolutions

Spin in one position – minimum of 8 revolutions

Spin Combination – minimum of 6 revolutions on each foot

Spiral Sequence

At least one spiral must be held for 3 seconds.

Repeats

A maximum of two elements may be repeated twice without music at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Marks

The assessment will take into consideration the grade of execution of the elements and the program components in determining a pass or fail. The program components must be of a proficient standard for the level throughout the program.

A pass cannot be awarded if any element has a GOE of -3 or more than 2 elements have a GOE of -2.

The program is evaluated as a whole as either a Pass or a Fail.

NOVICE LEVEL

Candidates attempting this test must have passed the Primary Level Singles Test.

A Short Program skated to music of the candidate's choice. The duration must not exceed 2 minutes 50 seconds, but may be less providing all the following elements are included:

MEN:

- a) Axel Paulsen or Double Axel
- b) One double jump immediately preceded by connecting steps, and/or other comparable free skating movements

- c) One jump combination consisting of two double jumps
- d) Flying spin (no change of foot, no change of position)
- e) Spin in one position (no change of foot, no flying entry)
- f) Spin combination with one change of foot and at least two changes of position (sit, camel, upright or any variation thereof, no flying entry)
- g) Two step sequences of a different nature (straight line, circular or serpentine) fully utilising the ice surface

LADIES:

- a) Axel Paulsen or double Axel
- b) One Double jump immediately preceded by connecting steps and/or other comparable free skating movements
- c) One jump combination consisting of two double jumps
- d) Flying spin (no change of foot, no change of position)
- e) Layback or sideways leaning spin (no flying entry, no change of foot)
- f) Spin combination with one change of foot and at least two changes of position (sit, camel, upright or any variation thereof, no flying entry)
- g) Spiral sequence fully utilising the ice surface
- h) One step sequence (straight line, circular or serpentine) fully utilising the ice surface

Jumps

No jump is to receive the equivalent of a downgrade from the intended number of revolutions.

The jump combination may consist of the same or another double jump. However, the jumps included must be different from the solo jump.

Spins

Flying Spin – minimum of 8 revolutions

Spin in one position – minimum of 8 revolutions

Layback or Sideways leaning spin – minimum of 8 revolutions

Spin Combination – minimum of 6 revolutions on each foot

Spiral Sequence

At least one spiral must be held for 3 seconds.

Repeats

A maximum of two elements may be repeated twice without music at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Marks

The assessment will take into consideration the grade of execution of the elements and the program components in determining a pass or fail. The program components must be of a proficient standard for the level throughout the program.

A pass cannot be awarded if any element has a GOE of -3 or more than two elements have a GOE of -2.

The test is evaluated as a whole as either a Pass or a Fail.

JUNIOR LEVEL

Candidates attempting this test must have passed the Novice Level Singles Test.

The program consists of 8 (eight) required elements. The sequence of the elements is optional.

The skater may perform any of the current Short Program Groups as listed in Rule 510 of the ISU regulations. The elements performed must be all from the one group, i.e. specific elements cannot be selected from multiple groups.

The duration of the program is as defined in Rule 501 of the ISU regulations.

Jumps

The jump combination may consist of the same or another double or triple jump. However, the jumps included must be different from the solo jump.

Spins

Flying Spin – minimum of 8 revolutions

Spin with one change of foot – minimum of 6 revolutions on each foot

Layback or sideways leaning spin – minimum of 8 revolutions

Spin Combination – minimum of 6 revolutions on each foot

Spiral Sequence

At least one spiral must be held for 3 seconds.

Repeats

A maximum of two elements may be repeated twice without music at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Mark

The assessment will take into consideration the grade of execution of the elements and the program components in determining a pass or fail. The program components must be of a proficient standard for the level throughout the program.

A pass cannot be awarded if more than one element has a GOE of -3 or more than two elements have a GOE of -2.

The test is evaluated as a whole as either a Pass or a Fail.

SENIOR LEVEL

Candidates attempting this test must have passed the Junior Level Singles Test.

The program consists of 8 (eight) required elements. The sequence of the elements is optional.

The skater shall perform the elements for a Senior Short Program as listed in Rule 510 of the ISU regulations.

The duration of the program is as defined in Rule 501 of the ISU regulations.

Jumps

The jump combination may consist of the same or another double or triple jump. However, the jumps included must be different from the solo jump.

Spins

Flying Spin – minimum of 8 revolutions

Spin with one change of foot – minimum of 6 revolutions on each foot

Layback or sideways leaning spin – minimum of 8 revolutions

Spin Combination – minimum of 6 revolutions on each foot

Spiral Sequence

At least one spiral must be held for 3 seconds.

Repeats

A maximum of two elements may be repeated twice without music at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Marks

The assessment will take into consideration the grade of execution of the elements and the program components in determining a pass or fail. The program components must be of a proficient standard for the level throughout the program.

A pass cannot be awarded if more than one element has a GOE of -3 or more than two elements have a GOE of -2.

The test is evaluated as a whole as either a Pass or a Fail.

C. TESTS IN PAIR SKATING

Rule 410

1. Candidates for pair skating tests will be judged as a pair and not as individuals, and will pass or fail as a pair.
2. The composition of a pair must be one lady and one man; both must be eligible or ineligible persons. A combination of eligible and ineligible persons is not permitted.

Rules 411 - 413 (Reserved)

Rule 414

1. There are three tests in pair skating.
2. REQUIREMENTS

NOVICE LEVEL

Prior to attempting this test, both candidates must have passed the Preliminary Level Singles Test.

A Short Program skated to music of the candidates' choice. The duration must not exceed 2 minutes 50 seconds, but may be less providing all the following elements are included:

- a) One lift selected from Group 1 to 5;
- b) One Twist Lift (single or double);
- c) One Throw Jump (single or double);
- d) One solo double jump;
- e) One solo spin with one change of foot and at least one change of position (may commence with a jump) min 5 revs on each foot;
- f) One pair spin (no change of foot, optional change of position) min 5 revs in total;
- g) One death spiral;
- h) One Step sequence (straight line, circular or serpentine) fully utilising the ice surface.

Jumps

No jump is to receive the equivalent of a downgrade from the intended number of revolutions.

Spins

Solo Spin – minimum of 5 revolutions

Pair Spin Combination – minimum of 5 revolutions in total

Repeats

A maximum of two elements may be repeated twice without music at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Marks

The assessment will take into consideration the grade of execution of the elements and the program components in determining a pass or fail. The program components must be of a proficient standard for the level throughout the program.

A pass cannot be awarded if more than one element has a GOE of -3 or more than two elements have a GOE of -2.

The test is evaluated as a whole as either a Pass or a Fail.

JUNIOR LEVEL

Candidates attempting this test must have passed the Novice Level Pair Test.

A Short Program skated to music of the candidates' choice.

The program consists of 8 (eight) required elements. The sequence of the elements is optional.

The skater may perform any of the current Short Program Groups as listed in Rule 513 of the ISU regulations. The elements performed must be all from the one group, i.e. specific elements cannot be selected from multiple groups.

The duration of the program is as defined in Rule 501 of the ISU regulations.

Jumps

Only one jump element is able to receive the equivalent of a downgrade from the intended number of revolutions.

Spins

Solo Spin Combination – minimum of 5 revolutions

Pair Spin Combination – minimum of 8 revolutions in total

Spirals

At least one spiral must be held for 3 seconds.

Repeats

A maximum of two elements may be repeated twice without music at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Marks

The assessment will take into consideration the grade of execution of the elements and the program components in determining a pass or fail. The program components must be of a proficient standard for the level throughout the program.

A pass cannot be awarded if more than one element has a GOE of -3 or more than two elements have a GOE of -2.

The test is evaluated as a whole as either a Pass or a Fail.

SENIOR LEVEL

Candidates attempting this test must have passed the Junior Level Pair Test.

The program consists of 8 (eight) required elements. The sequence of the elements is optional.

The skater may perform any of the current Short Program Groups as listed in Rule 513 of the ISU regulations. The elements performed must be all from the one group, i.e. specific elements cannot be selected from multiple groups.

The duration of the program is as defined in Rule 501 of the ISU regulations.

Jumps

Only one jump element is able to receive the equivalent of a downgrade from the intended number of revolutions.

Spins

Solo Spin Combination – minimum of 5 revolutions

Pair Spin Combination – minimum of 8 revolutions in total

Spirals

At least one spiral must be held for 3 seconds.

Repeats

A maximum of two elements may be repeated twice without music at the Judges' discretion.

Pass Marks

The assessment will take into consideration the grade of execution of the elements and the program components in determining a pass or fail. The program components must be of a proficient standard for the level throughout the program.

A pass cannot be awarded if more than one element has a GOE of -3 or more than two elements have a GOE of -2.

The test is evaluated as a whole as either a Pass or a Fail.

D. TESTS IN ICE DANCING

Rule 415

1. Tests in ice dancing comprise selected pattern dances at each level.
2. A candidate may choose any partner, subject to the approval of the Judges. The composition of a couple attempting a test is one lady and one man. However, if necessary, female or male Coaches may partner same gender test candidates. A combination of eligible and ineligible persons is permitted.
3. A dance partnership with a current record of Primary Championship participation or above, may choose to be judged as a couple for Novice, Junior, and Senior Pattern Dance Tests.

Rule 416

1. The music for each prescribed pattern dance is selected by the Test Organiser or Test Referee from the CFSA and ISU dance recordings.
2. The dances must be skated as specified in the Regulations for Ice Dancing. The general figure skating elements (steps, turns, movements and carriage) contained in the dances must be performed as specified in the Schedule of pattern dances, and in these Regulations. (See [ISA Rule 335](#) and ISU Rules 600-608)

Rule 417

1. The dances may be skated in the order in which they are set out in the Schedule or in the order requested by the candidate, if agreed by the Test Organiser or the Test Referee.
2. The introductory steps are optional and shall not exceed the introductory phrasing (ISU Rule 603).
3. The number of sequences to be skated for all pattern dances must be in accordance with the Regulations for Ice Dancing. ([ISA Rule 335](#) and ISU Rule 640)
4. The dances in these tests may be attempted separately, in any order, in which case a certificate only is awarded to successful candidates, and for each dance a separate test fee is payable. When these dances are attempted separately, a repeat is not permitted. When the test is taken as a whole, only one dance may be re-skated at the judges' discretion. Candidates will be credited with any dance passed and the failed dance may later be taken separately.

Rule 418

1. In the case of a fall, the dance should be continued at the next technically practicable point. See ISU Rule 638 for interruptions and applicable deductions for Pattern Dances.

Rule 419

There are six tests in pattern dances.

All dances are evaluated using the requirements for marking pattern dances as per ISU Rule 608.

- a) Dutch Waltz
 - i) Sequence 1 – Steps 1 to 8
 - ii) Sequence 1 – Steps 9 to 16
 - iii) Sequence 2 – Steps 1 to 8
 - iv) Sequence 2 – Steps 9 to 16

- v) Sequence 3 – Steps 1 to 8
 - vi) Sequence 3 – Steps 9 to 16
 - vii) Sequence 4 – Steps 1 to 8
 - viii) Sequence 4 – Steps 9 to 16
- b) Canasta Tango
- i) Sequence 1 – Steps 1 to 7
 - ii) Sequence 1 – Steps 8 to 14
 - iii) Sequence 2 – Steps 1 to 7
 - iv) Sequence 2 – Steps 8 to 14
 - v) Sequence 3 – Steps 1 to 7
 - vi) Sequence 3 – Steps 8 to 14

Remarks

For each sequence of a dance, judges will mark the accuracy of the skating and placement.

Pass Marks

A pass cannot be awarded if more than one sequence of a dance has a GOE of -3. The Timing and Skating Skills of the performance will also be taken into consideration as part of the evaluation. The dance is evaluated as a whole as either a Pass or a Fail.

PRE-PRIMARY LEVEL

Candidates attempting this test must have passed the Elementary Level Dance Test.

- a) Swing Dance
- i) Sequence 1 – Steps 1 to 8
 - ii) Sequence 1 – Steps 9 to 15
 - iii) Sequence 1 – Steps 16 to 23
 - iv) Sequence 1 – Steps 24 to 30
 - v) Sequence 2 – Steps 1 to 8
 - vi) Sequence 2 – Steps 9 to 15
 - vii) Sequence 2 – Steps 16 to 23
 - viii) Sequence 2 – Steps 24 to 30
- b) Fiesta Tango
- i) Sequence 1 – Steps 1 to 8
 - ii) Sequence 1 – Steps 9 to 16
 - iii) Sequence 2 – Steps 1 to 8
 - iv) Sequence 2 – Steps 9 to 16
 - v) Sequence 3 – Steps 1 to 8
 - vi) Sequence 3 – Steps 9 to 16
 - vii) Sequence 4 – Steps 1 to 8
 - viii) Sequence 4 – Steps 9 to 16

Remarks

For each sequence of a dance, judges will mark the accuracy of the skating and placement.

Pass Marks

A pass cannot be awarded if more than one sequence of a dance has a GOE of -3. The Timing and Skating Skills of the performance will also be taken into consideration as part of the evaluation. The dance is evaluated as a whole as either a Pass or a Fail.

PRIMARY LEVEL

Candidates attempting this test must have passed the Pre-Primary Level Dance Test.
