2016 Technical Regulations Communication No 91

ISU Communication 2000

All Skaters, Coaches and Officials are advised **ISU Communication 2000** will be implemented **commencing 1 June 2016**.

Skaters and Coaches should work toward implementing changes to programs as outlined below and with reference to ISU Communication 2000.

Cluster feature in step sequence for a level feature needs to be performed both on left and right feet to count as feature for **all levels**.

Windmill (Illusion) - will only be counted only once per program first time it is attempted. This means as a difficult entry (1 rev) into a spin or if used as NB (3 revs) position in a spin.

Flying Spin (no change pos or foot) only requirement a clear visible jump, if not V. You still must get into position within two revs **but no longer need to stay in that position for 2 allowing flexibility to change to another feature/position**.

“Change of foot executed by jump” & “Jump within a spin without changing feet”: are awarded only if the skater reaches a basic position within the first 2 revolutions after the landing. **No longer need to stay in that position for 2 allowing flexibility to change to another feature/position**.

V is no longer applied to flying combo spins for the flying entry. V is only used if there are not three basic positions in that spin.

Competition Implications

The updated IJS software is pending release, therefore 2015/2016 SOV will be in use until such time as updates are received.

ISU Congress

Pending outcomes from ISU Congress (June 2016) further ISA Communications will be released to keep the skating community current with changes.
