#### C. CHAMPIONSHIPS AND COMPETITIONS

The general rules in Section 5 (Championships) also apply to Synchronized Skating.

### **Rule 1038**

## **AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS**

- 1. The Australian Championships consist of five divisions:
  - a) Adult
  - b) Novice (Advanced Novice only)
  - c) Junior
  - d) Senior
  - e) Open
- 2. The provisions of ISU Rule 109.2d) are applicable to the inclusion of skaters from foreign ISU Members to compete in Australian Synchronized Teams at an Australian Championship, viz up to 25% of a team may be from a foreign Member if so permitted by the country of which the skater is a citizen.

In the event that any calculation results in a fraction of less than one whole team member, the result will be rounded up in the event that the fraction is 0.5 or more, and rounded down when the fraction is less than 0.5.

### **Rule 1039**

## INTERNATIONAL NOMINATIONS

1. Nominations for ISU Events

Recommendations to the ISA Board for nominations to World Championships, Junior World Championships, other ISU competitions or sanctioned competitions conducted by an ISU Member will be made by a panel of International and/or National Senior Synchronized Skating Judges in consultation with the ISA Operational Directors for Synchronized Skating and High Performance.

2. Team Composition

Any team seeking nomination for World Championships, Junior World Championships, other ISU competitions, or sanctioned competitions conducted by an ISU Member must skate in their programs the number of eligible skaters as prescribed by ISU Rule 701.3 or the relevant competition announcement, at the preceding Australian Championships.

At least 75% of the members of any team nominated for World Championships, Junior World Championships, ISU Competitions, or sanctioned competitions conducted by an ISU Member must have been entered for the same team at the preceding Australian Championships and have been present at those Championships.

In the event that any calculation results in a fraction of less than one whole team member, the result will be rounded up in the event that the fraction is 0.5 or more, and rounded down when the fraction is less than 0.5.

3. Team Replacements

Replacement team members may be selected in accordance with Rule 1039.2 and must meet the applicable age and eligibility requirements for Adult, Novice, Junior and Senior events.

## ADULT SYNCHRONIZED SKATING CHAMPIONSHIP OF AUSTRALIA

Participation in an Adult Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia shall be open to financial members of a State Association in a team:

- 1. All of whose members have attained the age of 18 years by July 1 preceding the competition and 75% of whose members have attained the age of 25 years by July 1 preceding the competition
- 2. Up to 25% may compete at a higher level (i.e. Senior or Junior) in the same Championships.
- 3. The percentage composition as defined in 1 and 2 above, must be maintained in the team that skates the competition program.
- 4. In the event that any calculation results in a fraction of less than one whole team member, the result will be rounded up in the event that the fraction is 0.5 or more, and rounded down when the fraction is less than 0.5.

## **Rule 1041**

An Adult Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia team must consist of at least eight (8) but not more than sixteen (16) persons and may include both ladies and men.

#### **Rule 1042**

The Adult Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia shall consist of a Free Skating Program only.

## **Rule 1043**

# **NOVICE SYNCHRONIZED SKATING CHAMPIONSHIP OF AUSTRALIA**

Participation in a Novice Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia shall be open to financial members of a State Association in a team:

- No more than 50% of the members of which have competed at a higher level either State, National or elsewhere.
- 2. No member of the team shall have attained the age of 15 by July 1 preceding the competition.
- 3. Where at close of entries at least 75% of the team must have passed the ISA Preliminary Skating Test or its equivalent (ISA Rule 516.3) and 50% must have passed Elementary Technical Pattern Skills or Elementary Dance or its equivalent (ISA Rule 516.3).
- 4. In the event that any calculation results in a fraction of less than one whole team member, the result will be rounded up in the event that the fraction is 0.5 or more, and rounded down when the fraction is less than 0.5.

## **Rule 1044**

A Novice Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia team must consist of at least twelve (12) but not more than sixteen (16) persons and may include both ladies and men.

#### **Rule 1045**

The Novice Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia shall consist of a Free Skating Program only.

## JUNIOR SYNCHRONIZED SKATING CHAMPIONSHIP OF AUSTRALIA

Participation in a Junior Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia shall be open to financial members of a State Association in a Team:

 Where at close of entries, all members of the Team must have passed Elementary Technical Pattern Skills or Elementary Dance or its equivalent (ISA Rule 516.3); and 50% have passed Pre-Primary Technical Pattern Skills or Elementary Dance or its equivalent. (ISA Rule 516.3)

AND

a) All members of the Team have not reached the age of nineteen as of July 1st preceding the competition (ISU Rule 108.3(b))

OR

b) No more than 50% of the members of the Team have competed at a higher level either State, National or elsewhere in the preceding season,

AND

- c) No more than 75% of the members of the Team have won a Junior and/or Senior Synchronized Skating Championship in the preceding season.
- 2. In the event that any calculation results in a fraction of less than one whole team member, the result will be rounded up in the event that the fraction is 0.5 or more, and rounded down when the fraction is less than 0.5.

## **Rule 1047**

## **TEAM COMPOSITION**

A Junior Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia team must consist of at least twelve (12) but not more than sixteen (16) persons and may include both ladies and men.

## **Rule 1048**

The Junior Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia shall be in two parts:

- 1. A short program
- 2. A free skating program.

### **Rule 1049**

### SENIOR SYNCHRONIZED SKATING CHAMPIONSHIP OF AUSTRALIA

Participation in a Senior Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia shall be open to financial members of a State Association in a team:

1. Where at close of entries, all members of a Senior National Championship team must have passed the ISA Pre-Primary Technical Pattern Skills Test or the Pre-Primary Dance or equivalent, and 50% have passed the ISA Primary Pattern Skills Test or Primary Dance or its equivalent (ISA Rule 516.3).

## **TEAM COMPOSITION**

A Senior Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia team must consist of at least twelve (12) but not more than sixteen (16) persons and may include both ladies and men.

## **Rule 1051**

The Senior Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia shall be in two parts:

- 1. A short program
- 2. A free skating program.

## **Rule 1052**

## OPEN SYNCHRONIZED SKATING CHAMPIONSHIP OF AUSTRALIA

Participation in an Open Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia shall be open to financial members of a State Association in a team:

No more than 25% of the members of the Team are competing in another team at the same championships.

In the event that any calculation results in a fraction of less than one whole team member, the result will be rounded up in the event that the fraction is 0.5 or more, and rounded down when the fraction is less than 0.5.

## **Rule 1053**

An Open Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia team must consist of at least nine (9) but not more than sixteen (16) persons and may include both ladies and men.

### **Rule 1054**

The Open Synchronized Skating Championship of Australia shall consist of a Free Skating Program only.

## **Rule 1055**

## **BASIC NOVICE COMPETITION**

Participation in a Basic Novice Competition shall be open to financial members of a Club or State Association in a team:

No more than 50% of the members of which have competed at a higher level (including Advanced Novice) either Club, State, National or elsewhere in the preceding season.

No more than 25% of the members of the Team are competing in another team at the same championships.

No member of the team shall have attained the age of 15 by July 1 preceding the competition.

In the event that any calculation results in a fraction of less than one whole team member, the result will be rounded up in the event that the fraction is 0.5 or more, and rounded down when the fraction is less than 0.5.

## **Rule 1056**

A Basic Novice team must consist of at least <u>nine (9)</u> but not more than sixteen (16) persons and may include both ladies and men.

At their discretion, organisers may split Basic Novice into A and B divisions as per <u>ISU Communication</u> 1760 or any subsequent update of this Communication.

#### **Rule 1057**

The Basic Novice Competition shall consist of a Free Skating Program only.

## **Rule 1058**

## **AFFILIATION**

Members of any one Synchronized Skating Team must all be members of the same State Association. Skaters may not represent more than one State Association in the same championship or competition.

18 or fewer skaters on the team list up to two (2) alternates

3. Awards

Alternates who have paid an individual entry fee and are confirmed at the draw are entitled to the same privileges and awards as the team members who compete.

# **Rule 1066**

# **MINIMUM TEAM SIZE**

1. Definition

Minimum team size must be met for the opening draw of the competition. A team not meeting this requirement will be declared withdrawn.

2. Exhibition

A team declared withdrawn may skate an exhibition with the agreement of the Championship Organising Committee.

3. Changes to Team Composition

Except for withdrawals on medical grounds, team composition may not be changed after close of entries. i.e Skaters may not be added to the team list.
