PRESIDENT REPORT

The first twelve months of being president of the APSA association, has been a very busy one, with a steep learning curve. My thanks goes to our outgoing president Judy Bosler for her continued support and encouragement, as our new team seek to learn all that is needed to run such a large association with 250 affiliated coaches from 4 State PSA's around Australia.



Our first task last year was to announce our strategic plan and the direction ahead for the association. This involved assessing

where our association was at in regards to our mission, and key areas of service provision. We decided on 5 projects that have been undertaken and in the 12 months have completed the following three of them with the Conference 2014 and the Database projects still in progress:

- > The accreditation review & implementation of new courses,
- > The new website and focus on communication,
- ➤ The implementation of trainer and mentor coaches,

This year has involved visiting our State PSA committee's and their members, to share our vision for the future as well as to encourage them in their coaching and professional development. One of the aims of our visits was to unite all coaches in Australia, in their understanding of APSA's role as their National body.

This year saw APSA purchase a new card printer for the purpose of supplying the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) cards to all accredited coaches along with having the new look Photo ID Membership Cards for 2013/14 being a credit card type card on a new APSA lanyard. The last of these cards are being printed and distributed.

There are a number of coaches who need to forward a current portrait photo for their ID Cards. Instead of holding up printing these cards their picture is a black silhouette.

All accreditation information and expiry dates are listed on the back of the card.

You will also notice there is also a Discipline section listed. For Level 0 coaches 'No' is listed in all disciplines. For new Level 2 and 3 coaches, this section will show your accreditation based on the successful completion of the Level 2 or 3, which is now discipline specific. For all Level 1 and older Level 2 and 3 coaches I have asked coaches to advise which discipline they are actively teaching.

A central database is being designed to hold coaches accreditation and membership information instead of spread sheets being shared by APSA and the state PSA's. As this is an enormous task, it will be a number of months before it is ready to undertake user testing and then rollout to state PSA's and individual coaches.

TREASURER'S FINANCIAL REPORT



At the end of 2012, the APSA committee agreed that Charmain Barnsley, who has been performing the role of Treasurer for both APSA and NSWPSA, was in need of assistance with her Treasurer duties as the work load was more than one person can manage. I was asked to take on the role of Treasurer for APSA and agreed. During the hand-over process, which has taken place over the last 6 months, Charmaine has trained me in MYOB software, the specifics of APSA's financial records and account statements, and any other relevant tasks that would allow me to perform the Treasurer's role independently. The

final stages of the hand-over process included adding me as a signatory on the account (and removing Gloria Pracey and Judy Bosler) as well as providing me with access to online banking. APSA has purchased the latest version of MYOB software and this has been installed on my computer. At this point, Tala is set-up to fully take on the responsibilities of Treasurer for APSA so any financial matters should be addressed to her.

As of Saturday, 19th October 2013, the National Australia Bank account balance is \$20,489.59.

The ING Direct account balance for APSA currently has a balance of \$ 2,981.23 earning 2.75% interest / annum.

The 2012/13 income and expenses for our association is included with this report.

ACCREDITATION REPORT



Accreditation has again had a busy year with a new Level 3 course being run, along with Level 0 and Level 1 courses.

Level 0 courses have now been run in 6 states (NSW, QLD, VIC, SA, WA and Tasmania) and are continuing to be popular with NSW planning one in the upcoming months.

Level 1 courses often follow on directly from the Level 0 (making it a 3 day onice course). Due to the change in assessment criteria, as established by the

ASC, a 45 min practical on–ice lesson is now part of the assessment, instead of the DVD's – this has proved to be popular and has meant that more Level 1 coaches are finishing their course, and in a shorter time frame.

The first Level 3 in many years was run in Sydney earlier this year – with 18 coaches attending – the course was a great success and hopefully all candidates will complete the coursework and be accredited Level 3 by March 2014.

Level 2 has also been busy with quite a few coaches finishing their Level 2 this year (some after many years ©), keeping Cathy Evans extremely busy with marking assignments.

The next Level 2 Sports Specific course is being held this November and looks to be a full and busy course with 25 coaches enrolled to attend.

Due to the change is Assessment criteria for all our courses, Adele Leghorn, after a lot of work, has resubmitted all our course frameworks (4) for new ASC approval – we are still waiting on the result, however I am confident that we will be fine.

Adele and myself attended a Coaching and Officiating workshop run by the Australian Sports Commission in September – it was an informative day and very interesting to see where some of the larger sports have headed in regards to Accreditation and education of their coaches – watch this space!

In the meantime, Adele Leghorn has had a team busily working on updating the Level 2 manual – I am looking forward to seeing it.

The last 12- 18 months have seen huge changes in our Accreditation Courses, from how they are run and administered to the course content and assessments. I wish to thank all involved for how well the changes have been accepted and taken on board.

2014 is looking to be a very exciting year with the 2nd Coaches Conference being planned, along with more accreditation courses.

My thanks go to each of the State Accreditation officers (Russell, Mary-Ellen, Robi, Loryn and Sally) for their help with Accreditation renewals, new accreditations and the administration of the new courses, to Adele Leghorn for driving all the changes to the programs and for her tireless contribution to Accreditation and Coach development in General; to Judy Bosler, Gloria Pracey, Kylie Fennell, Cathy Evans, Charmain Barnsley, Jean McGregor,

Paul Huehnergard, Monica MacDonald, Kristian Ryan, Christine Wallace, Madonna Randall, Stephen Carr, Robi Chalmers, Dorothy Bissett, Mark Hochman, Cameron Medhurst and Rodney Hocking for their contribution with presenting and/or assessing our courses.

UPDATE POINTS REPORT



On closing last years update point database, I am pleased to say that over 97% of coaches have achieved their required number of update points.

In June, the Updating Policy was rewritten. A lot of time and effort was dedicated in its revision and it can be found under 'Coach Information'/'Update Points Program' on the APSA website. Along with section for Level 0's, the new APSA Update Points Log Sheet is also included in the document for coaches to print off and utilise.

The main changes made were:

- 1. All points for all levels will be required 'per calendar year' (removal of 2 year "carry over")
- 2. Points must be gained by more than one "activity type" (activities have been sorted into 3 categories Accreditation/Skating Related/Non-Skating Related)
- 3. Level 3 coaches to go from 15 to 20 points per calendar year (Level 0: 5 points, Level 1: 10 points, Level 2: 15 points, Level 3: 20 points)

This year, there have been some state changes in regards to whom and when points need to be submitted. If any coach is unsure who log books need to be submitted to (copies only, no originals), please contact your state delegate.

As per the Updating Policy, please find below the dates for when points need to be submitted:

- ➤ Jan 31st for previous Sept, Oct, Nov, Dec
- ➤ May 31st for previous Jan, Feb, Mar, Apr
- > Sept 30th for previous May, Jun, July, Aug

The APSA Directors and Officer's Policy (D&O) was renewed in September 2013

All insurances are current as at the date of this report.

There was one circumstance under the APSA D&O policy, which may give rise to a claim under the policy, which has been notified to the broker/insurer. The matter is in the process of being fully reported to the broker; however the insurer has not indicated it requires further information at this stage.

A comprehensive review of the totality of APSA's insurance arrangements will occur in November/December, with a view to be well-informed for the renewal of other insurances in January 2014 and moving forward.

Further, a review will be undertaken as to the ongoing suitability of the current arrangements in respect the 'sharing' of certain insurances with Ice Skating Australia.

In late March, four of our members travelled to Sydney to attend the first Level 3 Accreditation Course in 15 years. It was a jam packed 4 days ending with some nervous candidates in the practical assessments. Have to give praise to Adele Leghorn, Cathy Evans & the whole APSA team who did an amazing amount of work to make this course possible.

ISA Junior Development again ran the Oceania Camp at Boondall 8-10 July with Course Conductor Kylie Fennell, assisted by QPSA members. I think all attendees found the 3 day camp a better option with less time away for interstate participants. Skaters enjoyed the course & Kylie's guiz on the last day.

Australia held its first ISU international event "SKATE DOWN UNDER" in August at Canterbury Ice Rink for Novice, Junior & Senior competitors. QLD was well represented in all divisions. Coaches, skaters, parents, officials & judges who attended were pleased with the event attracting overseas participants despite a short lead in time and giving our skaters the chance to obtain their TER scores at home. Hopefully this will be an annual event.

Being Olympic selection year we also had David Kranjek, Jordan & Andrew Dodds & their coaches be part of the Olympic Shadow Team who travelled to Sydney for their AOC team assembly day. It was exciting to be part of it all, get the run down on Sochi and AOC info, mix with other winter team members plus meet some of the AOC officials. We also got decked out & fitted with the Australian team gear. Not to mention the flu shot!

Manon Perron and Igor Tchiniaev from Canada once again ventured to our shore in September school holidays for a ISQ Development Camp organised by Athlete Development Officer & all round champion Matt Dodds. This time around proved just as popular and even the coaches expressed their thanks to skaters' on their full participation in the week's programme, saying they always enjoy working with them.

QPSA hope to hold Level 0 & Level 1 Accreditation Courses early in the new year once training of conductors has been completed. Expressions of interest will go out in November.
